Spring Brindley serves as Lincoln County School System's Supervisor of Career Technical Education (CTE). In her 14th year of education, she has had opportunity to teach in both Tennessee and Georgia. After teaching two years in Georgia, she returned to Lincoln County, joining Ninth Grade Academy where she spent five years as an agriculture teacher, three years as assistant principal, and three and a half years as principal.

Throughout her time here, Mrs. Brindley has garnered numerous awards and recognitions. She was one of 45 individuals nationwide in 2008 to receive the Teachers Turn the Key Award from the National Association of Agricultural Educators. She was also voted Best High School Teacher in The Elk Valley Times' annual reader survey, named Lincoln County Teacher of the Year, NGA Teacher of the Year, and Luella High School Teacher of the Year. She has also been named to Who's Who Among American High School Teachers. While under her leadership, NGA was featured in *US News and World Report* as one of America's Best High Schools in 2015.

A native of the Flintville area and an LCHS alumnus, she earned her BS in Agricultural Economics and Business at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville, her M.Ed. in Agriculture Education from the University of Georgia and her Ed.S. in Administration and Supervision from Middle Tennessee State University. She and her husband, Paul, are the parents of Emory Monea Brindley.

David Golden is a Flintville native and attended Flintville Elementary School, where he now serves as principal, and Flintville Junior High. He is a 1993 graduate of LCHS and played on the 1990 state championship football team, earning All Mid-State and Tennessee All-Star Team accolades. He went all to play and letter all four years in football at Maryville College where he majored in English for Teacher Licensure. After graduating, he coached football at Maryville College before beginning his teaching career.
